

The need for websites, apps and other digital shopping experiences that require expert technical knowledge is driving demand for Software Development Engineers and Software Engineers. Mobile Experts also made the list, as mobile-first shopping experiences have almost become table stakes in the competition for customers.

Data Scientists and Business Analysts are indemand tech occupations for their contributions to identifying efficiencies, streamlining processes and forecasting.

Top States

Washington placed second on the list of states hiring the most retail-related technologists, for an obvious reason: It's the home of Amazon, which needs thousands of technologists to help run its operations. As more Americans have turned to online shipping, Amazon has grown considerably, swelling the state's technologist numbers.

Retail and eCommerce companies in California, Texas, Georgia and other states are likewise hungry for the kind of advanced tech talent that can help make retail operations more efficient and "smarter."

Top Employers

Unsurprisingly, Amazon continues to demand tech talent, far outpacing all other employers on this list. The Home Depot, which started the year needing more technologists than Best Buy and Walmart, slowed its hiring after January, moving the home improvement retailer down the list.

Advance Auto Parts, especially with its <u>investment</u> <u>in hybrid and electric vehicles</u>, and AutoZone with its successful <u>improvement of fast deliveries and online customer interactions</u>, show signs of continuing to innovate in a market that's expected to <u>surpass \$140 billion by 2027</u>.
